Council Approves Application To Federal Investing In Canada Infrastructure Program For Phillips Reservoir

Council directed Administration Monday to submit an application for the Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program: Green Infrastructure - Environmental Quality Subauthorize the municipality's cost share up to \$2,000,000.

The federal and provincial governments are investing up to \$150 million in the second intake of the ICIP Green - Environmental Quality Sub-Stream to help communities across the province address their infrastructure needs, while supporting environmental quality through infrastructure projects.

Local governments are eligible for up to 73.33% funding from senior government (40% federal and 33.33% province); therefore the City would need to fund a minimum of 26.67% of the eligible costs.

The project recommended by staff is the Phillips Reservoir Bypass Pipeline and Intake Valve Replacement. The Bypass Pipeline involves the



installation of a 2.5 km pipeline that will allow the City to bypass the Phillips Reservoir without interrupting water supply to the City's water distribution network. This will enable the City to take the Phillips Reservoir offline for maintenance (ex: dam maintenance and sediment removal), or unplanned events, while maintaining secure and reliable water supply to the City. The Intake Valve controls the City's main water supply from the Phillips Reservoir, and requires replacement as it is nearing end-of-life. The project's total estimated cost is approximately \$7.24 million. With the City portion being approximately \$1,931,280, it is recommended that the City's portion of the cost be covered through borrowing.



For many grant applications related to Drinking Water or Wastewater, having a Council endorsed Water Conservation Plan is one of the basic criteria required.


