Thomas Walker, a local brick-layer, was also considered to be a “stone-mason”. This is borne out by the fact that the back of his home shown here is constructed almost completely of flat stone-work, the only example of this determined in Cranbrook.

Two brick wings face north and east with a large verandah joining them. The corner of this verandah is constructed with round stones to support the roof. Some of the brick details include the arches over the windows, and the thickened corner (reminiscent of the detail on the old City Hall).

A lovely hedge and hedge archway give a magnificent frame to this residence. It is an important example of residential construction and should be maintained to provide foil to new development in this area.
