

# **COVID-19 Regional Update – May 14, 2021**

Good afternoon all, Nathan here with an update on COVID-19 in the region and province for May 14.

### Vaccine Registration Open to anyone over 18

Vaccine registration is now open to anyone 18 years old and up. If you have not registered yet, now is the time to do it. You can register yourself or someone else, like a parent or grandparent. Everyone 18 and older in BC is eligible to get vaccinated.

**Second Doses:** If you got your first dose in a pharmacy and have never registered using the provincial system, make sure you are registered here: <a href="http://gov.bc.ca/GetVaccinated">http://gov.bc.ca/GetVaccinated</a> You'll get notified when it is time for your second dose. If you got your first dose through the registration process, you will be automatically notified when it is time for your second dose.

This is Our Shot – Town Hall on May 19 at 6:00 pm MST.

**This is Our Shot** is hosting a virtual Town Hall meeting on **Wednesday, May 19 at 6:00 pm MST**, and their panel of medical specialists is ready with the answers to any question they have about the vaccines. #### Here are some notes from the Friday May 14, 2021 Provincial COVID-19 update:

- Over 50% of eligible British Columbians have now received their first dose of COVID-19 vaccines.
- 494 new cases of COVID-19 in BC (33 in Interior Health) in the past 24 hours.
- Cases by Local Health Area. COVID-19 cases for the most recent 7-day period (May 2 to May 8).
   <u>The map</u> is updated weekly, on Wednesdays. Fernie Health Delivery Area = 5, Cranbrook Health Delivery Area = 7, Kimberley Health Delivery Area = 0 and Windermere (Columbia Valley)

  Health Delivery Area = 6.
- There have been 2 new COVID-19 deaths in the province with a total of 1,634 COVID-19 deaths in the province since the beginning of the pandemic.
- A total of 138,304 cases since the beginning of the pandemic.
- 5,548 active cases of COVID-19 in BC.
- 387 individuals currently hospitalized in BC with COVID-19 with 141 of those in intensive care. For Health Authority specific stats visit the <u>BCCDC COVID dashboard</u>.

- 130,953 people who tested positive have recovered.
- 2,393,265 doses of a COVID-19 vaccine have been administered in BC; this is spread across all health areas.
- Travel restrictions for non-essential travel in B.C. are in place until May 25. Learn more about these orders here.

Pregnant people in B.C. can safely get COVID-19 vaccine.

All pregnant people who are age 16+ are now eligible to receive the COVID-19 vaccines as a priority population through B.C.'s Immunization Plan. Read the full statement here.

School exposures information

As many of you know, there have a been a few school exposures in our region over the last little bit, so I wanted to share with you how the school exposure notification works. A "school exposure notification" does not mean all students at the school have been exposed to COVID-19. If you do not receive a phone call or letter from Interior Health (IH), your child should continue to attend school. It is imperative that you monitor your child for COVID-19 symptoms daily. If a student or teacher receives a confirmed positive COVID-19 test result, IH will start contact tracing to determine how the person was infected and who they were in close contact with. Then IH will identify and notify close contacts who may be at an increased risk and advise them to self isolate and monitor for symptoms for 14 days. Finally IH will work closely with the school and school district throughout the case and contact tracing process to maintain close communication with the school community.

IH public health determines close contacts of individuals who have tested positive for COVID-19 using specific criteria, based on likelihood of transmission.

Seek a test if you have two or more of the following symptoms for more than 24 hours, and they are not related to any other pre-existing conditions:

- Sore throat
- Loss of appetite
- Extreme fatigue or tiredness
- Headache
- Body aches (muscles and joints aching)
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea
